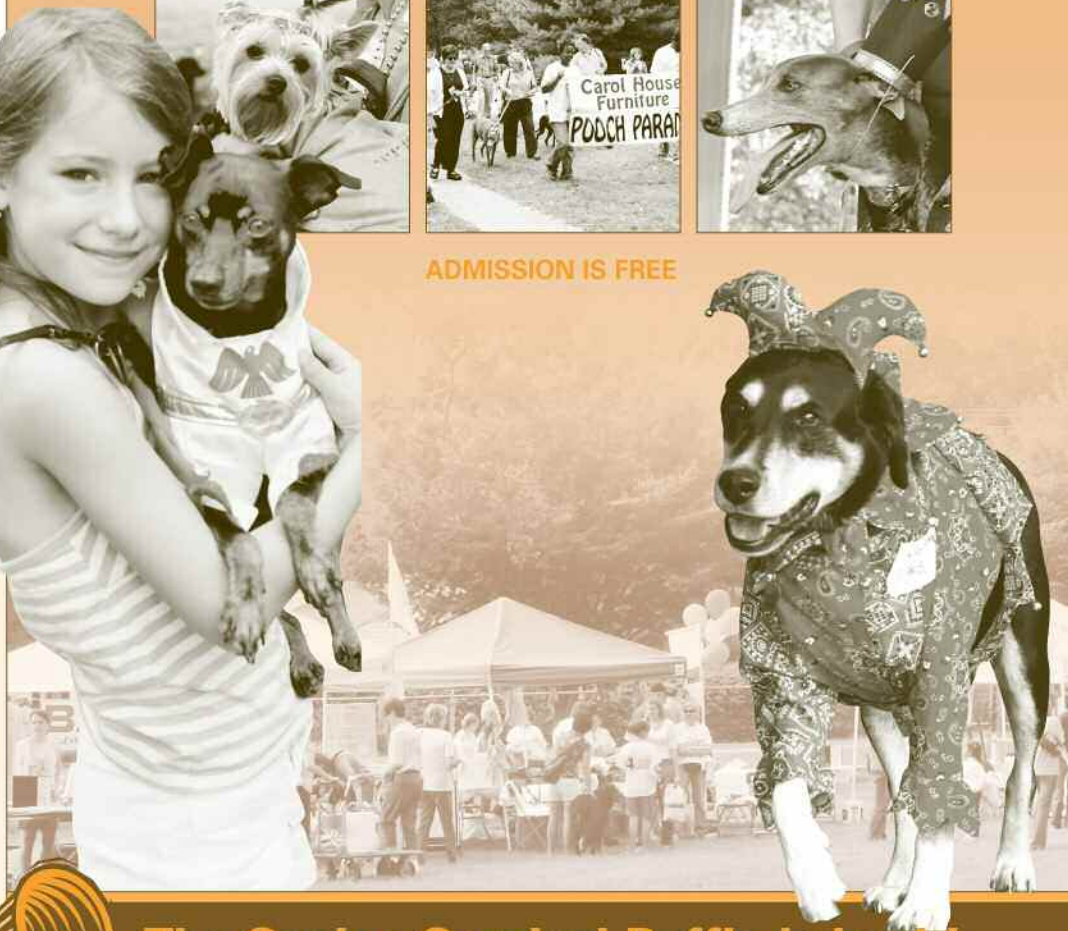

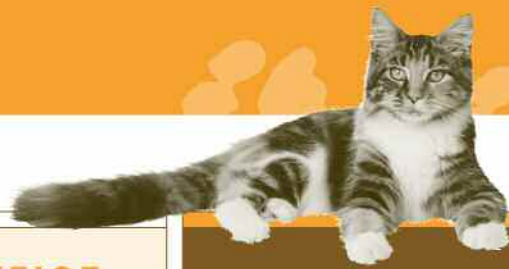

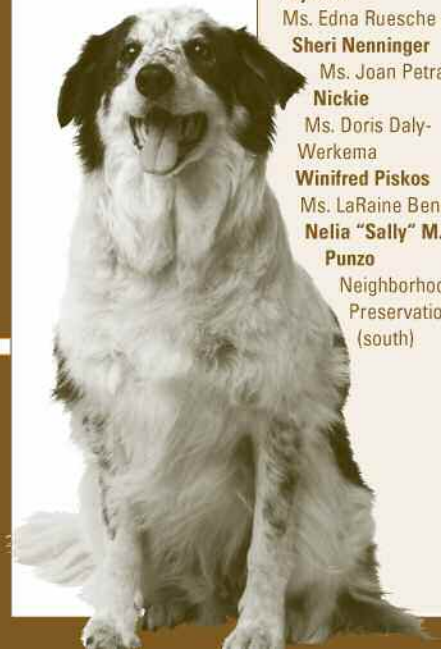

Expectant Mothers Should Be Cautious – but you don't have to get rid of your cat!

Many times women hear that they should give up their cats when they become pregnant. They are afraid of a disease called Toxoplasmosis, but don't really know much about it.

Toxoplasmosis is an infection caused by the parasite *Toxoplasma gondii*. According to the Center for Disease Control, more than 60 million people in the U.S. probably carry the parasite but the immune system keeps the parasite from causing illness.

Toxoplasmosis is spread when cats eat infected rodents, birds or other small animals. The parasite is passed through the cat's feces. Mature cats are less likely to shed the parasite but young cats can shed millions of parasites in their feces 3 weeks after infection. If you unintentionally touch your mouth after changing a litter box or while gardening without gloves, you may be exposed. Also, fruits and vegetables can be contaminated so it is important to

wash or peel them before eating, and people can become infected by eating or handling raw or under-cooked meat.

Expectant mothers should be cautious of the parasite because it can cause problems in pregnancy. **But, it isn't necessary to give up your cat because you are pregnant! Here are a few tips to reduce the risk of exposure to Toxoplasma:**

- Have someone else change the litter box. If you have to change it, wear disposable gloves and wash your hands afterwards.
- Change the litter box daily.
- Don't feed your cat raw meat.
- Keep cats inside.
- Avoid stray cats and kittens.

Heartworm Preventative Protects Owners Too

Most people are aware of the importance of monthly heartworm protection for their dogs, but are you aware your dog's heartworm protection is also protecting you? No, you won't get heartworm, but the preventatives also protect your dogs from the most common types of intestinal worms (roundworms and hookworms) that people can also get.

Roundworms in dogs can cause diarrhea, weakness, scruffy coat and can be fatal to puppies. In people, they can cause damage to internal organs, pneumonia and even blindness.

Hookworms in dogs can cause bloody diarrhea, weakness, weight loss, and death. In people, the worms get under

the skin causing red itchy skin or internally cause severe nausea.

These worms are passed dog-to-dog or dog-to-people through the dog's stool. The worms can either be ingested or penetrate through the skin. The risk is highest in children because they are more likely to be exposed to fecal contaminated areas – yards, parks, playgrounds.

So for your health and your pets – go to your veterinarian for yearly heartworm and stool checks on your dogs. **Always use heartworm preventative year round.** •

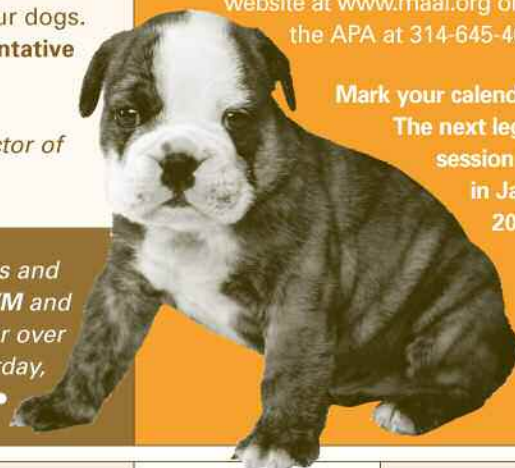

A Win for Animal Welfare

The APA is excited with the results of the 2006 Legislative session, which ended on May 12. Many bills were proposed that threatened the work we do, and we appreciate and applaud those representatives that voted on behalf of the animals and their welfare. We were especially pleased to see that House Bill 711, which would have penalized public and private animal shelters for spaying and neutering certain breeds of dogs, failed to get any support.

Please remember that politics are not a spectator sport, and your voice does matter. If you disagree with legislation that your representatives are proposing, please call them and voice your opinion. CATS ARE SO MISUNDERSTOOD!

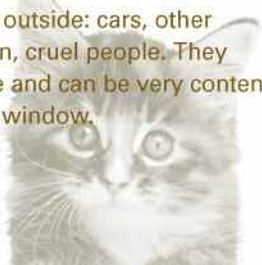
Here are some myths about our fantastic felines...
